Although on-line proceedings played a role in some arbitrations in years past, start to finish remote on-line arbitration was thrust upon us suddenly in 2020 due to COVID restrictions This experience has served to expedite the acceptance and adoption of the remote model as an efficient, and often less expensive option, for the arbitration process. On-line arbitration has evolved quickly, and arbitrators and advocates continue to adapt to this "new normal." As counsel, parties and arbitrators have

become more comfortable with on-line proceedings, there is now an expectation that it will remain an alternative to in-person arbitration even after COVID restrictions are lifted. This roundtable discussion will focus on the advantages and disadvantages of remote arbitration, the future of online arbitration, and provide practical information and skills for conducting a successful remote arbitration.
